Thank you for your interest in applying for funding for a Baltic-American Security Exchange from the Baltic-American Freedom Foundation.

The objective of the Security Exchange is to support national security enhancement efforts by the three Balticstates consistent with the mission of the Baltic American Freedom Foundation and based on an unwavering commitment by the United States of America to Baltic security.

Funded program projects will facilitate the exchange of critical knowledge and establish useful contacts be- tween Baltic and U.S. security experts and make other tangible contributions in Estonia, Latvia, and Lithuaniaaimed at advancing resilient and stable societies.

Proposals may be initiated by Baltic or U.S. entities, private or public, either separately or in collaboration. Pro- posed projects of up to one year in duration may take the form of individual security expert exchanges, trainingand development fellowships, meeting participation, consultation visits, or other types of projects designed to address appropriate national security concerns.

As detailed on the Application Form, a strong proposal will include an outline of project objectives, a timeline, a specific and well-researched budget, a detailed implementation plan, and criteria for evaluating the expected impact of the project. Review of the proposal and final approval will be the responsibility of a designated representative of the BAFF Board of Directors and the Chairman.

Proposals will be evaluated quarterly, with applications due on the first of February, June, September, and November, annually until further notice. All application documents, as specified in the Application Checklist, must be submitted at one time, by email attachment to BASE@balticamericanfreedomfoundation.org.

The applicant organizations (the "Applicant Organizations") named in Section I. of the Application are applying to receive funds from the Baltic-American Freedom Foundation ("BAFF") through its administrator, the Council on International Educational Exchange ("CIEE") to implement a program (the "Program") supporting the security of the Baltic states and the United States of America through professional exchanges and international collaboration on topics of mutualinterest.
- 2. The Applicant Organizations selected by BAFF and CIEE agree to receive funds to implement the program under the terms of this agree ment (the "Agreement").
- 3. The Applicant Organizations assume all responsibility for each Program Participant, including each Program Participant's suitabilityand reliability, the views expressed and the quality of the Program presented, and any and all contractual agreements between the Applicant Organizations and the Program Participant. BAFF and CIEE specifically disclaim any legal or financial responsibility for Program Participants or arrangements between Applicant Organizations and Program Participants. This includes, but is not limited to, all travel before, during, or after the funded program by a Program Participant; the quality or availability of any entity that provides goods andservices for the Program; lack of, access to, or quality of medical carethat may be required; airfare and any refunds requested or required. All Program Participants, and neither BAFF nor CIEE, are responsiblefor their acts along with any resulting loss or damage associated withthe Program.
- 4. The views expressed by the Program Participant are his or her own and do not represent the views of BAFF.
- 5. Any documents released to the media or otherwise presented by the Applicant Organizations regarding the Program shall contain the message, "This program is made possible by funding from the Baltic-American Freedom Foundation (BAFF). For more information about BAFF scholarships and programs, visit www.balticamericanfreedom-foundation.org."
- 6. The Applicant Organizations agree to hold harmless BAFF and CIEEfor damages or loss to any party associated with the Program. BAFFand CIEE make no representation or warranty of any kind, expressed or implied, as to the suitability of the Program, and BAFF and CIEE disclaim all such warranties to the full extent of the law.
- BAFF and CIEE reserve the right to select a limited number of Applicant Organizations to receive funding based on the findings of the selection committee as to which Applicant Organizations best embody the values, goals, and objectives of BAFF.
- 8. Monetary amounts awarded to successful Applicant Organizations may vary depending on the scope and location of the individual proposal. BAFF and CIEE reserve the right to adjust monetary awards at their discretion. Furthermore, BAFF and CIEE reserve the right to reject the application of any Applicant Organizations and/or to refusesponsorship

- to any Applicant Organizations or Program Participantsthat BAFF and CIEE do not deem appropriate to participate in the Program.
- Should the Program not come to fruition for any reason, the Applicant Organizations agree to immediately return all funds granted to implement the Program.
- 10. Any dispute concerning, relating, or referring to this Agreement, the brochure of any other literature concerning the Program, or the Program itself, shall be resolved exclusively by binding arbitration pursuant to the Federal Arbitration Act, 9 U.S.C. §§1-16, either according to the then existing Commercial Rules of the American Arbitration Association (AAA) or pursuant to the Comprehensive Arbitration Rules and Procedures of the Judicial Arbitration and Mediation Services, Inc. (JAMS). Such proceedings will be governed by substantive (but not procedural) Maine law and will take place in Portland, Maine. The arbitrator and not any federal, state, or local court or agencyshall have exclusive authority to resolve any disputes relating to the interpretation, applicability, enforceability, conscionability, or formation of this contract, including but not limited to any claim that all orpart of this contract is void or voidable. By agreeing to these terms and conditions, the Applicant Organizations (and BAFF and CIEE) arewaiving the right to a trial by jury.
