As the Baltic-American Freedom Foundation concludes its tenth year, I am proud to present the programs and activities BAFF has supported to achieve our mission “to deepen the ties between and among Estonia, Latvia, Lithuania, and the United States through programs of education and exchange centering on economic growth and democratic values”.

Our enduring legacy is the people who have completed research, education, and professional internships through BAFF Scholarships. From the outset, BAFF has identified its mission as creating a vibrant alumni network of professionals with strong ties to each other and to the U.S. equipped with the skills and experience to lead the next generation of Baltic business, educational institutions, and social enterprises.

BAFF alumni now include over 600 Baltic citizens who have benefited from U.S. exchanges. During 2019, we dedicated significant resources to develop a unique alumni leadership structure. In 2020, twelve Board-appointed members of the inaugural BAFF Alumni Council began collaboration on the design of alumni programs to ensure the ongoing impact of BAFF participation. A larger group of BAFF Alumni Ambassadors contributed to event planning and implementation. Many virtual programs were created in response to COVID-related restrictions. We look forward to resuming full scholarship and alumni programming, including celebrating our Tenth Anniversary, starting Fall 2021.
