- (1) Living expenses paid for Baltic university students and recent graduates to intern with U.S. companies and organizations.
- (2) Scholarship awarded to post graduate Baltic students to attend U.S. universities.
- (3) Living expenses paid for professors and academic researchers from the Baltics to conduct independent or collaborative research projects in the U.S.
- (4) Living expenses paid for experts in field of Security Support from the Baltics to conduct independent or collaborative research in the U.S.
- (5) Travel expenses paid for Baltic High School students to study and experience the U.S.
- (6) Cultural activities in U.S. for Award participants.
- (7) Networking activities in the Baltic States for Award participant alumni.
- (8) Yearly awards of €10,000 and €5,000 to the most innovative Estonian individual or firm that developed a product in cooperation with a U.S. partner (2012 - 2017). Yearly contributions of €8,500 towards the Transatlantic Business Award Program in honor of an Estonian company that made a significant achievement within the United States market, which might include strategic collaborations with U.S.-based organizations, implementation of innovative solutions, or significant company growth or investment activities (2018 - ongoing).
- (9) Travel expenses paid for 8 Latvian business incubator representatives to travel to New Orleans for Idea Village's annual Entrepreneurship Week; travel expenses paid for one senior Idea Village representative to consult in Latgale with 5 business incubators (2013).
- (10) Grants up to \$10,000 to NGOs, university faculties, and similar institutions in the Baltics to host U.S. speakers on topics of interest to their communities.
- (11) Any Baltic team that qualifies for the Rice Business Plan Competition will be given a travel grant up to \$10,000.
- (12) Awards of €10,000 and €5,000 to a Lithuanian individual or firm that has developed an innovation in cooperation with a U.S. partner (2017 - ongoing).
- (13) DOE led series of energy capacity building workshops in the Baltic States.
- (14) Six fellowship rotations in the Baltic region for U.S. academics, government officials and members of the expert community over a two-year period (three fellowships per year) that will engage both senior and rising U.S. strategists in the research and analysis of Baltic security issues. The goal of the fellowship program is to develop deepened U.S. expertise on and engagement with the Baltic countries as a renewed frontier of U.S. national security and foreign policy. The initiative seeks to achieve this goal by supporting U.S. strategic scholarship and expertise in Baltic security issues and increasing awareness of the Baltic Sea region as a critical area for strategic research and analysis within U.S. policy and academic communities.
- (15) Four-year funding commitment of \$250,000 per year to support security program initiatives.
- (16) Three-year partnership with the McCain Institute at Arizona State University to sponsor the development of a Next Generation Leader (NGL) in the national security field from each of our three Baltic countries at \$125,000 per year.
- (17) Awards of €10,000 and €5,000 to the most innovative Latvian individual or firm that developed a product in cooperation with a U.S. partner for the years 2018-2020. Includes €2,000 in start-up costs for 2018.
- (18) A grant to the FSVC to assess the current structure and operations of the Internal Security Office within SRS and analyze any potential gaps against international best practices and standards.
- (19) 35 individual travel grants for the Association for the Advancement of Baltic Studies (AABS) conference at Stanford University.
- (20) 2018 Baltic Business Summit and Lennart Meri Conference. 2019 Baltic Centennial Boston.
